<u>Change in the classroom</u>: After the holidays we swapped our book corner and home corner. The children were so happy to explore their new environment. It is important for their emotional development to: *explore their environment, *to notice differences and similarities, *to experience change in a safe environment with people they trust. They see that change can be exciting and positive and learn to accept and enjoy it. We had a lot of fun preparing and enjoying all the holiday themes. Children learned lots of new vocabulary and also increased their cultural awareness of Christmas and The Traditions of Tet.

We have changed our theme for Term 2 and we are learning about sharing & caring. To embrace the theme we are planning lots of group activities. It helps the children to make connections, make sentences, use polite words, communicate and negotiate with others.

Every morning children enjoy exploring the activities of our different classroom centers. For example: in the sensory corner children experience the manipulation of objects, new textures and messy play. Children learn to get messy and it's good for them to understand "what happens if..."

In the writing corner children trace, color, use rulers to make lines, stick and stamp. The other day we had some letter stickers on the table and the children found the letters of their name and stuck them on the paper to make their name. Afterwards they took markers and wrote their names in upper case letters.

Math corner is for children to make puzzles, play matching games, sort, measure and compare.

Everyday during all our activities the children are learning to be more confident, learning to understand their emotions and express them the correct way. We are here to provide the children with the tools they need to grown and learn while enjoying and loving their environment.

We have been learning about the people in our community and the children really enjoy learning what it means to be a firefighter, a policeman and a doctor.

We were all very thankful to Dr. Runa from Family Medical Practice (Roku's mom) for coming and showing the children what doctors do and what they need to take care of people.

<u>Jolly Phonics</u>: We have finished learning the first group of sounds s, a, t, p, i, n. We are now in the second group c/k, e, h, and m. The children loved to repeat letter sounds and sing the songs. They are linking letter sounds and starting to make three letter words.
