Messy play!

Cornflower goop

- 2 cups cornflour
- 1 cup cold water

Slowly add the cold water to the cornflour in a bowl. Stir until the water is absorbed by the cornflour.

Add food colouring if desired.

Play dough Cornflower goop

- 1 cup flour
- ¹/₂ cup salt
- 1-2 tablespoons oil
- 2 teaspoons cream of tartar
- 1 cup water

Mix all the ingredients together in a saucepan and the add oil and water. Cook slowly over a low heat until the dough comes away from the edges of the pan and it becomes difficult to move with a spoon. Remove from heat and cool until it can be handled.

Fluffy paint

- 2/3 cup soap flakes
- 1/3 cup water
- Powdered paint or food colour

Combine all the above and whip until fluffy

Mud dough

- 2 cups mud
- 2 cups sand
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup salt

Mix all the above together and add enough water to make pliable
