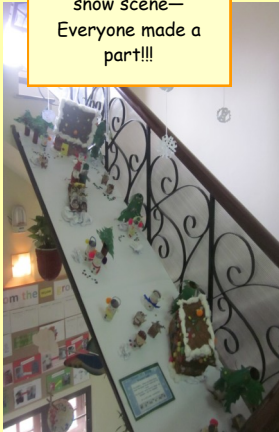

Celebrating together

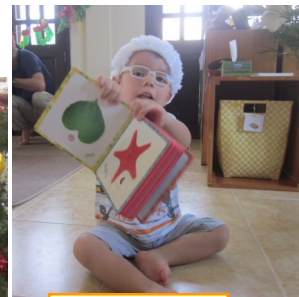

Liliana blows the snowflakes to make a blizzard.

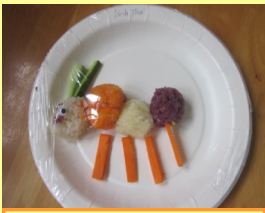

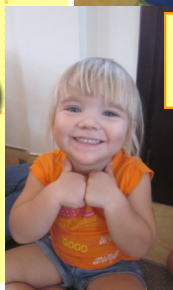

When children feel confident in themselves, they are more able to achieve and their development is spurred on. Since Christmas, in the Yellow Group, we have been thinking about what we are good at, what we like about ourselves and what like about each other. We made a 'snap cup' which is a special cup that we pass around the group. It has all the children's faces inside and each child chooses a friend from the cup to talk about. Then we all say what we like about that friend. In the beginning some children felt quite shy to have the attention on them, but as we practice, now they are becoming so proud of themselves and aware of what their friends are doing!
