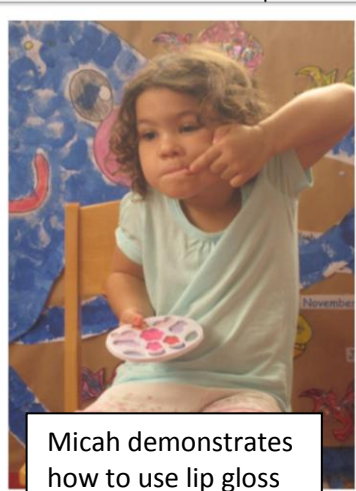
During the past few months, we have really grown comfortable in our classroom, and now we know all the rules and routines!

International Week

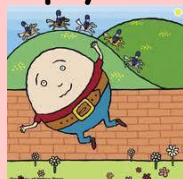

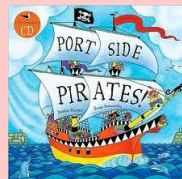
